

Battles of the Seven Years War, volume 2

Errata, August 1, 2010

The following errors have been identified in this book. Additions and corrections are noted in red.

W1 HASTENBECK

Terrain: Omit the reference to the Wessel River; it is off-map to the west..

The Streams: All streams are marshy-banked **where marked**.

Victory: To win, the French must capture the **road exit point to the** town of Afferde, thus cutting the Allied line of communication and forcing a withdrawal north toward Hanover. Failing this, the Allies win.

W2 KREFELD

Terrain: **There should be a bridge crossing The Great Ditch at Votzhoeffe.**

Smaller Table: **If the smaller table is used, allied troops may enter on the finger of land between the Laqndwehr and the Great Ditch**

W3 BERGEN

Victory: To win, the allies must capture **two** out of **three** key objectives, those being the town of Bergen and the **two** hills. Failing this, the French win.

Deployment: The French deploy anywhere on the west half of the table, but including all of the town of Vilbal **and all of the open ground up to and including the eastern-most sunken road**.

W5 WARBURG

The Diemel: The Diemel River is treated as a marshy banked stream. **The Diemel enters in the middle of the west edge, flows southeast, then east past Warburg and then off the south edge.**

Streams: The streams shown on the map have **marshy** banks.

W6 KLOSTER KAMP

Smaller Table: If a smaller gaming area is available cut up to two feet off the northwest edge and up to two feet off the northeast edge. **The victory locations for both players then become capture of the north battlefield corner (by the Allies) or the east battlefield corner (by the French).**

E1 GROSS JAEGERSDORF

Terrain:

The Pregel: The Pregel River is un-crossable except at the bridge..

Deployment: The Russians set up their troops first. All troops set up on the **eastern** half of the battlefield.

E2 ZORNDORF

The Streams: All streams on the map have marshy banks **where marked**.
