THE NORWEGIAN ARMY IN 1940

Norway had nearly disarmed during the 1920s and 1930s, and although it made efforts to correct major deficiencies in equipment, by the time of the German attack most items were still on order rather than in the force structure.

The German attack caught the Norwegians off balance, and efforts to mobilize during the battle produced chaos. Some units did mobilize, but it was haphazard, and the fact that the Germans early on overran the mobilization centers of the southern infantry regiments (and captured the muster rolls of their reservists) only added to the difficulties. Unit which did mobilize generally did so at partial strength, and sometimes without key equipment. For example, the Germans captured the depot of the 3rd Artillery Regiment at Trondheim with most of its artillery pieces, so the gunners who did manage to reach their units were equipped as infantry instead.

NORWEGIAN TOE 1 INFANTRY DIVISION/BRIGADE, 1940

There were six territorial divisions before the war. Upon mobilization each would form a brigade (a 7th Brigade was formed as well) with the combat elements of the division. The regiments did not fight as complete units. Instead, regiment headquarters frmed groups which controlled two to five battalions of infantry drawn from whatever regiments were available and supported by a battery or two of artillery, all serving under the general command of the brigade.

The Dragoon regiments which formed part of three divisions are treated separately. The reconnaissance squadron whown as part of division/brigade troops was generally detached from one of the dragoon regiments, and it could as easily be a horced cavalry squadron.

NORWEGIAN TOE 2 DRAGOON REGIMENT, 1940

There were three dragoon regiments shortly before the war. Each was supposed to have two cavalry and two cycle squadrons, although squadrons were stripped out to give infantry divisions/brigades a cycle squadron. The actual field organization of 1st Dragoon Regiment is not known. 2nd Dragoon Regiment had to horsed and one cycle squadron while 3rd Dragoon Regiment had one horsed and two cycle squadrons, in both cases in addition to their two machine-gun squadrons.
