

BURON 07 June 1944 By Doug Eaglesham

June 6th 1944 showed the return of Western Allies back on European soil since being forced off during the fall of France in1940 to the Nazi Regime. The United States, Britain and Canadians were the major contributors to the landings on Normandy Beach with the Canadians meeting the majority of their objectives on the first day. The assault on Juno Beach was spearheaded by two assault brigades of the 1st Canadian Infantry Division and after the

beach head was consolidated, the 9th Infantry Brigade, which was in reserve, was brought forward to take up the advance and by nightfall, the advance guard of the 9th Brigade, the North Nova Scotia Highlanders, accompanied by the 27th Armoured Brigade, the Sherbrooke Fusilier, had taken up position around Villons-les-Buissons.

The next day, the advanced continued, meeting light opposition and by mid day, the town of Buron was secured, after which, C company along with the main vanguard, moved towards Authie. A Company had moved towards Gruchy in the Southeast while B and D companies stayed in Buron. The Sherbrookes then deployed in between Authie and Buron while their recon tanks, Stuart MkV's attached to the vanguard were stationed more closer to Franqueville. Because of this advance, the SF and NNSH had outrun their artillery support from the 14th Field Regiment as well as naval support from a supporting British warship, but this was due to radio failure.

Situation

Following the North Nova Scotia Highlander's advance into Buron and surrounding villages, a kampfgruppe of the 12.SS Panzer Division "Hitlerjugend" led by Standartenfuhrer Kurt Meyer is assembling nearby in Abbey d'Ardenne. At 1500 on June 7th 1944, the attack against the Canadians began.

Weather (Optional)

Historically, weather was clear.

Battlefield

BUA: all BUA are classed as Hard Cover Watercoarse: Stream Vegetation: Woods and Groves Fields: various fields surround the area but is mainly open with little in the way of cover, such as hedges.

Historical Outcome- German Victory

By the time the battle had ended, both sides had taken heavy losses. The Canadians had put up a valiant defense, but due to constant German artillery barrages and the onslaught of the assault, the Canadians were forced to pull out of Buron and its surrounding area. German losses were not clear nor precise, yet the Canadians lost 242 men, 84 were fatal, 128 were taken prisoners and the Sherbrooke Fusiliers had lost an estimated 21 tanks with 7 damaged. Canadian tankers claimed to have destroyed or damaged 31 German tanks.

Canadian Forces

Mission: Hold. Prevent the German forces from retaking the towns of Authie, Gruchy and Buron Historical Units Troop Quality: All are Regular, Morale: 8

Initial Troops

North Nova Scotia Highlanders, 9th Infantry Brigade, 3rd Infantry Division

Headquarters with: 1 Command Stand 1 Half track A, B,C & D Companies, each with: 1 infantry command stand (integral PIAT) 2 infantry stands (integral PIAT) <u>11th PI/ C Coy, Cameron Highlanders of Ottawa (MG):</u> 1 MMG 1 Universal Carrier <u>Support Company, with:</u> 1 6pdr ATG 1 3 inch Mortar 2 Universal Carriers

27th Armoured Regiment (Sherbrooke Fusiliers), 2nd Canadian Armoured Brigade:

<u>Headquarters, with:</u> 1 Sherman V (75) 1 Crusader II AA <u>Recon Squadron:</u> 2 Recon Stuart MkV <u>3 Squadrons, each with:</u> 1 Command Sherman V (75) 2 Sherman V (75) 1 Sherman Firefly Vc (17pdr)

Reinforcements- Optional

14th Field Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery (arrives after turn 4- Off Board Artillery) 34th, 66th, 81st Batteries, each with: 2x 105mm Priest
Naval Support (Off Board Artillery, after Turn 6 with 1 Fire mission every 2 turns) British Light Cruiser HMS Belfast w/ 16" guns
L Troop, 105th Battery, 3rd Anti Tank Regiment, Royal Canadian Artillery: 1 M10 (3")

Notes:

The 14th Field Regiment and its escort, 3rd Anti tank with its M10's, had come under mortar bombardment while moving forward to support the NNSH, but by the time they were able to get under way again, the NNSH and others had already abandoned Buron. The Naval support from the HMS Belfast was lost prior to the German counter attack due to radio failure and when it was finally reestablished Buron and surrounding area had been lost.

If the Reinforcements are used, the 34th Artillery Battery is classed as 'Dedicated' to the Infantry Regiment and Batteries 66 and 81 are 'Supporting'. All three Batteries use the 'British Artillery Rule' as per 18.1.1.2 on page 55. Naval Artillery is 'Supporting' to the Infantry Regiment. The M10 of L Troop is under the command of the Infantry Battalion and deploys with C Coy, NNSH.

German Forces

Mission: Counter attack. Retake the town's ofAuthie, Gruchy and Buron. Historical Units Troop Quality: Veteran, Morale: 9

Initial Troops

Kampfgruppe Meyer, 12. SS Panzer Division "Hitlerjugend"

Headquarters, with: 1 Command Stand 1 car or motorcycle 3. Battalion, 25. SS Panzer Grenadier Regiment, with: 1 Command Stand 1 car 9, 10, 11 Companies, each with: 1 PanzerGrenadier Command stand (integral Panzerfaust) 2 PanzerGrenadier stands (integral Panzerfaust) 1 Weapons stand 12. Company, with: 1 Pak 40 75mm ATG 1 75mm Infantry Gun 1 80mm Mortar 1 Sd Kfz 11 1 Sd Kfz 10 3. Ptn/13. company: 1x 150mm sIG 1 Sd Kfz 11 14. Company (Flak): 2 Sd Kfz 10/ 20mm Flak

2. Battalion, 12. SS Panzer Regiment, with:

<u>Headquarters, with:</u> 1 Command Panzer IV H <u>5. & 6. Companies, each with:</u> 1 Command Panzer IV H 3 Panzer IV H

3. Battalion, 12. SS Artillery Regiment (off board)

9. Battalion with 1x 150mm Field Gun 10. Battalion with 1x 100mm K 18

Notes:

The 13 and 14 companies of the infantry battalion are both under the commands of the Kampfrgruppe HQ and the Infantry Battalion HQ. The 10th Artillery Battalion is 'Dedicated' to the infantry battalion while the 9th is 'Supporting'.

Set Up

<u>Canadian Player deploys first</u>: NNSH Command and B & D Coys deploy within 6" of Buron. A Coy deploys within 6" of Gruchy. C Coy, NNSH Support Coy, CH of O (MG) within 6" of Authie. The SF recon, 2 Stuart MkV tanks, deploy close to or around Franqueville to the south. The Sherbrooke's are deployed in between Buron, Gruchy and Authie. <u>German Player deployment</u>: KP Meyer Command is deployed at the Abbaye d'Ardennes. The Pz Gren battalion deploys within 14" of the Abbaye with Panzer company 5 & 6 deploying on each flank of the infantry.

Victory Conditions

Victory goes to the player than holds the majority of the towns Authie, Gruchy and Buron. Players may also wish to use the 'Mission Victory' rule 48.1, page 106 of main rulebook.
