1 NOTE ON ACCURACY

The Indians jealously guard organisational details, so information is somewhat fragmentary. Tank regiments are well detailed and the data below can be considered accurate. Info on mechanised regiments is available and the organisation for those is broadly correct. Artillery organisations are broadly correct. Information on engineers, air defence and recce units is patchy; some educated guesswork has gone into the low level organisations.

2 ARTILLERY DOCTRINE

The Indians love their artillery. In 2012 there were 200+ regiments (regiments have 12 "real world") guns

Indian artillery doctrine is similar to that of the British at the end of WW2 but emphasises close support over massing of fire. In the lists below field batteries are shown supporting a manoeuvre battalion or regiment. The heavy regiment has a counter battery and H&I role.

One unique feature of Indian Infantry divisions is the light regiment (and the equivalent mortar battery in mountain divisions). This is an acknowledgement that the terrain and infrastructure in India is not always suitable for heavy guns. So infantry battalions in poor terrain may have a light battery supporting rather than a field battery. The 1971 war indicated an Indian tendency to attach extra battalions to Indian brigades. The light regiment leaves a division with some "spare" batteries to provide them with support.

In the late 1990's the army started to move to a more balanced fire support doctrine. Cymbeline CBR were introduced to Brigades. This trend continues with the expansion of the Brigade targeting battery to a battalion with the introduction of UAVs. As of 2012 the number of UAVs is limited and they are probably not widely deployed in divisions, but that looks set to improve

- 1) There were two armoured divisions, the 1st & 31st. In 1993 a third was organised the 33rd.
- 2) The catapult 130mm SPG entered service circa 1988. The organisation of Indian artillery Brigades is unclear over this period. There were enough Abbots produced for 11 batteries and enough Catapults for 16-28 (depending on which production figures you believe). It's possible that all the artillery in the brigades was converted to Catapult. Note that one battalion will be without artillery support as there are 9 batteries and 10 battalions to support
- 3) The detailed organisation or the engineer regiment is unknown. It is likely to have had three field squadrons (companies) or engineers, one to support each armoured brigade, and an equipment company with rubber boats, BLT Kartik, MT-55 or MT-72 and other bridging equipment

- 3) All BMP-2 have AT-5A missiles. These were upgraded to AT-5B in 2004
- 4) One mechanised battalion or tank regiment will be without artillery support as there are 9 batteries and 10 battalions to support
- 5) Circa 2010 the division received the ACCS artillery command system. Upon receipt any command stand capable of calling artillery can call all (or part of all) of the division's artillery on a 1-3
- 6) The targeting battery is technically a brigade level asset, however operationally it will be usied to target one of the gun regiments
- 7) The detailed organisation or the engineer regiment is unknown. It is likely to have had three field squadrons (companies) or engineers, one to support each armoured brigade, and an equipment company with rubber boats, BLT Kartik, MT-55 or MT-72 and other bridging equipment

- 6) Presence of Field Engineer Company is likely but unconfirmed

5.3 Independent Armoured Brigade 1972 – 1999

The brigade has broadly remained unchanged since the 71 war until today, consisting of 3 Tank Regiments, 1 Mechanised Battalion, an Artillery Regiment and a Recce squadron. Lower level organisation changed apace with those in the tank divisions.

The OT-64 entered service in 1972

Brigades probably never had the Catapult SPG

- 1) The division has remained mostly unchanged in organisation since WW2
- 2) The motorisation status of the divisions is unclear. It's presumed that all units are motorised in trucks. Jeeps star out as Mahindra copies of the US WW2 jeep. Staring from 1965 the Jonga Jeep starts to supplement, then replace the Mahindra. In 1980 the Mahindra CJ340 starts to replace the Jonga, though there are still pelnet of the original Mahindra in service
- 3) In 1965 the infantry had the old British 3" Mortar this was being replaced by the E1 81mm by the 71 war
- 4) SAM stands are confirmed as of the introduction of the SA-16. It's possible that SA-7 stands were part of the battalion earlier than that. Initial deliveries of SA-7 started in 1976
- 5) Not all divisions have a Tank Regiment. It's unclear if regiments are a permanent part of the division's structure or independent regiments are attached as needed. Regiments are organised in the same way as those in an armoured division (see above). In the 65 war armoured regiments would have been equipped with Shermans. In the 71 war they were equipped with Centurion, T-54, T-55 or Vijayanta. By 1978 all T-55 had been up-gunned to 105mm. The first T-72's entered service in 1980, though they possibly went to the armoured divisions and brigades first. Its unclear whether T-90's will be deployed to infantry divisions. The last T-55 left service in 2008.
- 6) Especially in the 65 and 71 wars, the squadrons from the tank regiment were attached individually to infantry brigades
- 7) In the 71 war some divisions had a light tank squadron of Sherman, PT-76 or AMX-13 attached (1 command tank and 3 tanks)
- 8) Allocation of ATGW is apparently done on an as-needed basis, so the organisation above is indicative. It is likely that individual stands may be allocated to individual battalions, giving each battalion a missile stand apiece. The first missiles to enter service were the ENTAC and SS.11. The SS.11 was by far the most prevalent. The Milan 1 and AT-4B both entered service in 1983, though the SS.11 remained in service alongside, used as a bunker buster. The Milan and AT-4 was used in roughly equal numbers. In 1993 the Milan 2 was inducted, followed by the Milan 2T in 2008. In 2004 the AT-14 Kornet entered service. The SS.11 was removed from service in 2012. All ATGW systems are dismountable from the jeep.
- 9) Field artillery regiments started equipped with 25pdr. This started to be replaced in 1967 by the M46 130mm. The D-30 122mm was delivered in 1971 which supplemented the 130mm but did not replace them. In the mid 70's some divisions received Indian 105mm Field Guns. It's unclear when the last 25pdr left service. The 105mm Field Gun 130mm were the mainstay of the field artillery until the delivery of the Bofors FH-77 155mm in 1987. This started the slow replacement of the 105mm and 130mm which continues to 2012 with the conversion of the M46 in to the M46S 155mm. The 122mm D-30 was retired in 2010
- 10) The heavy regiment started with 5.5" guns. In 1967 some divisions received D-20 152mm. In 1987 the Bofors FH-77 was delivered and its likely the heavy regiment was re-equipped before the field regiments
- 11) The light regiments would have initially been 3.7" Howitzers but would have changed to Indian 105mm field guns (IFG) in the mid 70's
- 12) The artillery calling number takes the lower un-bracketed number before 1985, the higher, bracketed, number 1985 and onwards. Circa 2010 the divisions received the ACCS artillery command system. Upon receipt any command stand capable of calling artillery can call all (or part of all) of the division's artillery on a 1-3

7.2 Mountain Division 1965+

The mountain division is a slight variation on the infantry division, being very similar in organisation. It is less likely to have a tank regiment attached, and that regiment is more likely to have lighter tanks. The main variation is the artillery. The guns attached to battalion will be light mountain guns starting with 3.7" Howitzers then moving to the Indian Light Field Gun in the mid 70's which is still in service. There are plans to replace it, and the guns in the heavy regiment, with M777 155mm howitzers but the status of that project is unclear in 2012

In addition from 1963 the artillery brigade has a 120mm Mortar battery, in place of the light regiment. Despite its name the battery is organised in the same way as an artillery regiment. It is equipped with Soviet HM-38 (1963) or French AM50 mortars (1970). It's not clear if the French mortars replaced or supplemented the HM-38, however the HM-38 is no longer in service. The Indian 120mm E1 mortar supplements the AM50, however its induction date is unclear

- 1) RAPID is an acronym for: Re-organised Army Plains Infantry Division. There are supposedly "offensive" and "defensive" divisions but the difference, if any, between the two types is unclear
- 2) The 12th Infantry Division is currently the only army formation with Arjun tanks. Others have T-72 & T-90
- Circa 2010 the divisions received the ACCS artillery command system. Upon receipt any command stand capable of calling artillery can call all (or part of all) of the division's artillery on a 1-3
- 4) The second mechanised battalion started to be added to the division c.2010
